
It is hoped that this document will be of interest to education planners who need to take advantage of the increasing knowledge and to adapt it to their specific needs.







Percentage of new entrants to Grade-I who have attended some form of organized ECE programme 2001-02 and 2005-06








Net Intake Rate (NIR) in Primary Education 2001-02 and 2005-06




Net Enrolment Ratio (NER) in Primary Education 2001-02 and 2005-06





Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) in Primary Education 2001-02 and 2005-06





Repetition of Girls in Primary Education 2001-02 and 2005-06



Gender Parity Index (GPI) for Transition Rates between Lower to Upper Secondary Education, 2001-02 and 2005-06










Public Expenditure per pupil as percentage of GNP per capita for Primary Education, 2001-02 and 2005-06


Public Expenditure on Primary Education as percent of Public Expenditure on Education, 2001-02 and 2005-06
