

Standardizing and Sharing Educational Data for Improved Decision-Making:

In April 2024, the Pakistan Institute of Education (PIE) improved educational data quality and accessibility by introducing a standardized National EMIS Database template aligned with the Data Standardization Framework (DSF). Provinces already provided DSF-compliant data to ensure consistency across systems. PIE also shared a modified coding scheme for seamless data integration, enhancing access to comprehensive educational data.





The 2nd review meeting in Karachi focused on the progress of Annual School Census DSF-compliant data collection on April 23, 2024. The meeting highlighted the importance of effective education data management in assessing educational quality, identifying regional disparities, and formulating data-driven policies. These efforts by PIE aim to ensure that educational data is readily available for informed decision-making, ultimately improving educational outcomes for all Pakistani children.

Launching the Non-Formal Education Statistical Report 2021-22:

PIE launched the Non-Formal Education Statistics Report 2021-22 in collaboration with the JICA Advancing Quality Alternative Learning (AQAL) project at a ceremony held at the AIOU main auditorium in Islamabad on April 4, 2024. Mr. Muhayudin Ahmed Wani, Secretary of the Ministry of Federal Education & Professional Training, was the chief guest. This comprehensive report, which gathers data on non-formal education, serves as a critical resource for informed decision-making. It acknowledges the contributions of non-formal education practitioners nationwide and is aimed at government agencies, donor organizations, NGOs, academicians, statisticians, civil society organizations, and private sector educational institutions. The launch marks a significant step in enhancing the visibility and understanding of non-formal education in Pakistan.



Technical Committee (TechCOM) and Coordination Committee (CoordCOM) Meeting:



The Technical Committee (TechCOM) and Coordination Committee (CoordCOM) meeting convened at the Pakistan Institute of Education (PIE) in Islamabad on May 28-29, 2024. This significant gathering focused on Non-Formal EMIS & consolidation of data from all federal/provincial stakeholders, reports on progress of SDG-4 (Quality Education) before its incorporation into the next report of Pakistan Education Statistics for the year 2022-23.

During the meeting, PIE presented comprehensive data from public and private sectors, covering formal and non-formal education across all levels. After thorough review and revisions, the data was officially endorsed by participants, marking a significant step towards informed decision-making and progress in achieving SDG-4 targets.




PUNJAB












KHYBER PAKHTUNKHWA
















The launch event for Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's National Achievement Test (NAT) 2023 Findings highlighted the importance of education in shaping a strong society. Education leaders acknowledged challenges like population growth and diverse backgrounds, and stressed the need for collaboration between government, educators, and the private sector.

Masood Ahmad, Secretary of Elementary & Secondary Education, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, emphasized the crucial role of passionate teachers in instilling integrity and trust within students. The NAT 2023 data, he said, is a valuable tool for developing focused strategies and building trust in the system. Ultimately, he said, the goal is to create a well-educated society with critical thinking skills, empowered to lead positive change.



BALOCHISTAN













In a significant educational assessment, 1,850 students from 106 public schools across Balochistan participated in the National Achievement Test (NAT) 2023. The results, released by the Pakistan Institute of Education, offer key insights into student learning, assessing Grades 4 and 8 in English, Urdu, Math, and Science.

Math scores are a concern, with Grade 4 students averaging 40% and Grade 8 students 31%. Grade 8 Science scores averaged 48%, below the national benchmark. However, Grade 4 English scores showed improvement, rising from 38% in 2019 to 51%.

Girls outperform boys in most subjects, except Math and Science, where scores were similar. Urban Grade 4 students scored higher in English, Math, and Urdu, while rural Grade 8 students did slightly better in Science.

These results provide a roadmap for the Balochistan Education Department to develop targeted interventions, particularly in Math and Science. Minister of Education Raheela Hameed Khan Durrani emphasized the importance of utilizing these insights to enhance education strategies. Dr. Shahid Soroya, Director General of the Pakistan Institute of Education, reiterated their commitment to working with the department to empower students across the province.



Item Bank Software Testing & Item Population of NPT-2025 on IBS:

Pakistan Institute of Education is excited to share recent updates from its National Assessment Wing (NAW) team. We've integrated 2,000 new items into our item bank software for grades 4 and 8 in subjects like Science, Math, English, and Urdu. These additions were developed in recent workshops and underwent rigorous quality checks for seamless user experience.

Achievement Milestone: Conclusion of Matric Examination Result Analysis in Pakistan Research Study in Collaboration with PAMS

The data collection phase of Matric Examination Result Analysis in Pakistan" by PIE's own Research Wing completed in May, 2024. Through the collaborative efforts of our team and PAMS, this research aims to provide invaluable insights into the trends and patterns of matric examination results in Pakistan, paving the way for informed policy decisions and educational reforms.

The groundwork for the upcoming National Policy Event on Girls' Education, developed in collaboration with PAMS and I-SAPS, has been completed. This event stands as a pivotal moment to address the critical issues surrounding girls' education, ensuring a concerted effort to enhance access, quality, and equity in educational opportunities for girls nationwide.

Inception Meeting of Research Advisory Group

The Pakistan Institute of Education (PIE) held the inaugural meeting of the Research Advisory Group (RAG) at the PIE Auditorium on 15th May 2024. Chaired by Dr. M. Shahid Soroya, Director General of PIE, the event gathered RAG members, Ministry representatives, educationists, researchers, and stakeholders from academia and development sectors.

Dr. Soroya highlighted PIE's role and the significance of RAG, while Dr. Zaigham Qadeer, Director of Research at PIE, outlined the group's purpose. Discussions focused on maximizing existing data, evaluating initiatives, and aligning research with national and provincial policies. Emphasis was placed on collaboration with academia and development partners to enhance research quality.

The meeting concluded with a consensus on the importance of thorough evaluations and developing a strategic research agenda. RAG, composed of distinguished educationists from across Pakistan, aims to leverage their expertise to identify critical research areas. Notable members include Prof. Dr Nasir Mehmood, Dr Nizam-ud-din, Pro. Dr Shahid Munir, DR. Farid Panjwani & Dr. Faisal Bari.

This gathering marks a significant step in PIE's commitment to evidence-based policymaking and advancing Pakistan's education sector.





Two Days workshop on Capacity Building under DARE-RC

The Pakistan Institute of Education (PIE), under its mandate to conduct collaborative and competitive research, recently organized a two-day workshop as part of the DARE-RC initiative. Funded by the British Government's Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO), DARE-RC aims to support PIE in developing robust research protocols, including research design and methodology. Oxford Policy Management (OPM) led the first workshop titled "Evaluating and Analysing Existing Evidence/Research and Synthesising it Succinct Relatable Reports." workshop aimed to enhance the skills of PIE



and policy stakeholders in Pakistan's education sector by providing training on literature review and meta-analysis to formulate research questions under expert supervision. Under backstopping and mentoring follow-up, PIE has designed three new research studies, focusing on two flagship reports (PES and NAT) and data strengthening. This workshop marks the beginning of a series designed to offer backstop support and build PIE's capacity in basic research.







Balochistan Education Minister visits PIE's Guidance for ZERO Out-of-School Children Campaign

Balochistan Education Minister Raheela Hameed Durrani sought technical guidance from Pakistan Institute of Education (PIE) to enroll 3.13 million out-of-school children (OOSC) during her visit. PIE, with support from Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA), briefed her on the successful "Zero OOSC" campaign in Islamabad. Inspired by this, Minister Durrani requested PIE's help for a similar initiative in Balochistan, focusing on strategies like formal schools, ALPs, and digital learning. The campaign will start in Quetta and expand province-wide, with full cooperation from JICA's AQAL project.







PIE and JICA Launch KP NFE Provincial Scorecard

Pakistan Institute of Education (PIE) and AQAL-JICA have launched the KP NFE Provincial Scorecard for the year 2021-22, providing a comprehensive overview of non-formal education in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. This initiative aims to drive strategic planning and policy formulation for improved educational outcomes, emphasizing inclusivity and equity as per the SDGs.









Balochistan Launches ZERO Out-of-School Children Campaign

Balochistan has become the first province to respond to the Education Emergency by launching the ZERO Out-of-School Children (OOSC) Campaign. The announcement was made during the 10th Balochistan NFE Forum meeting held at Sikandar Jamali Auditorium, Quetta.

The event was graced by Honorable Minister for Education Ms. Raheela Hameed Khan Durrani, Secretary School Education Mr. Saleh Muhammad Nasar, and Secretary Social Welfare Department Mr. Abdul Rehman Buzdar. They emphasized Balochistan's commitment to ensuring every child's right to education.


